Parish Notices

The purpose of having Christmas every year is not just to have an annual reminder of the birth of Jesus, and the reason we recall Easter every year is once again not about just remembering the death of God of the cross, and the resurrection life that comes. These things are done regularly so that the stories may sink into our flesh and our bones and shape the lives that we lead. The season of creation is repeated with the same intent, that it too may inform our lives.

I recently came across a resource from http://www.ecologicalexamen.org/ which is designed to help the awareness raising and I thought I would share it with you. It is a series of questions to guide a time of meditation and I would encourage you to give it a try

- I give thanks to God for creation and for being wonderfully made. Where did I feel God's presence in creation today?
- 2. I ask for the grace to see creation as God does in all its splendour and suffering. Do I see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the poor?
- 3. I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable. What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation?

How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead stand in solidarity with creation and the poor?

- 4. I ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation. Where have I fallen short in caring for creation and my brothers and sisters? How do I ask for a conversion of heart?
- 5. I ask for the grace to reconcile my relationship with God, creation and humanity, and to stand in solidarity through my actions. How can I repair my relationship with creation and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?
- 6. I offer a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable in our society.
