



A recent article written by Rev'd Andrew Schmidt:

A few years ago, when I started working as a school chaplain I did a post-graduate teaching degree, which taught me quiet a lot. The longest lasting lesson has been about teachers and people who teach subjects. I was in the latter group, I loved my subjects, Math and Religion, and would happily try and share that love with anyone. Teachers on the other hand are an amazing type of human being, because their specialty is not a subject, but students.

I was talking to a teacher friend about her current area of fascination, which was all about the power of belief to affect a change in people. In one sense that comes as no surprise to me. I have seen many people make a change in their lives through the power of faith. One recent example is of a person who has tried once again to quite cigarettes, helped by the belief that God does not want him smoking himself into an early grave. I don't know if he will succeed long term, but his faith has given him the drive to dust himself off and try again.

My teacher friend however was sharing with me that her students' brains are actually physically altered, at a neurological level, by the belief that they can
